## Experts

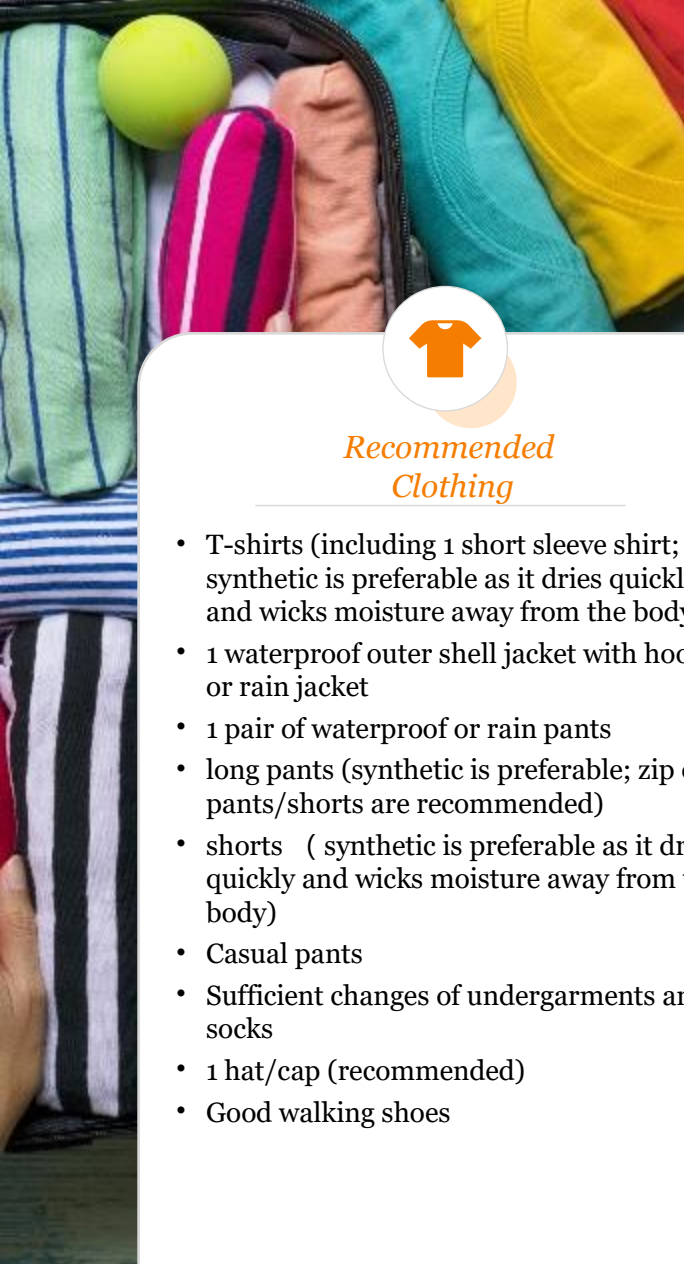
- Specialize in a specific activity or sport and are responsible only for the module/activity they are delivering

### *Recommended Clothing*

- long pants (synthetic is preferable; zip off pants/shorts are recommended)
- shorts (synthetic is preferable as it dries quickly and wicks moisture away from the body)
- Casual pants
- Sufficient changes of undergarments and socks
- 1 hat/cap (recommended)
- Good walking shoes

- Lip salve, such as Blistex or Carmex
- Moisturizer
- A personal hand/face towel
- Face Masks

On our crisis management team are veterans in the industry and include Mr. Simon Drayton, a former international search and rescue professional corp member and former British Coastguard manager.

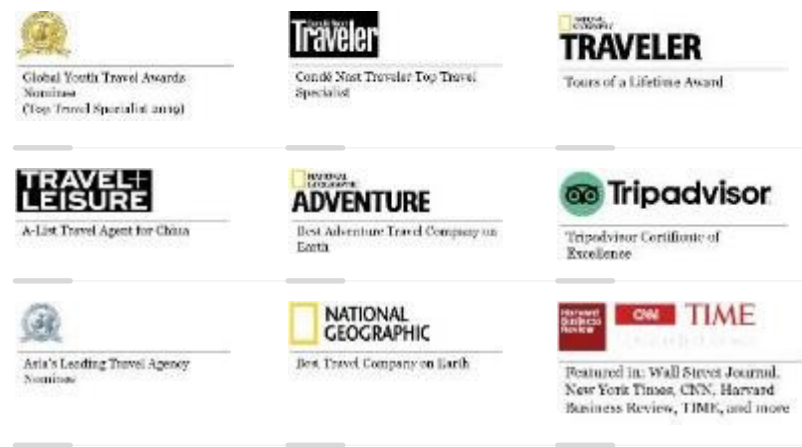

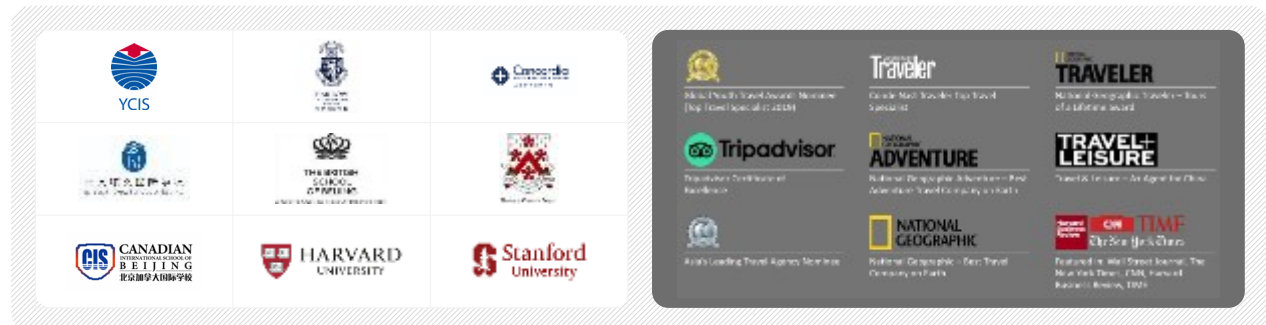
